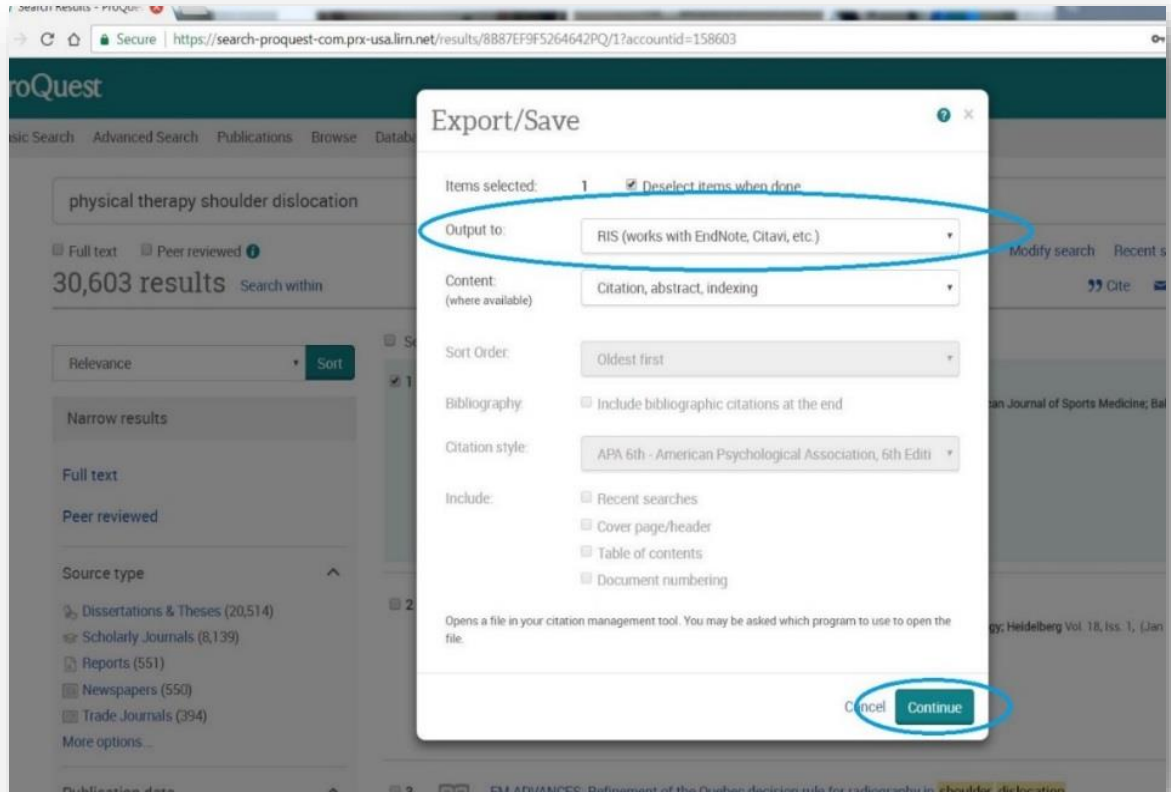
EndNote: Transferring Citations from ProQuest

There are many ways to add citations to your EndNote library. Many resources, like ProQuest, provide simple solutions for transferring citations directly into Endnote.

- 1) Run a search in ProQuest, and checkmark the article(s) you'd like to export to your EndNote library. Click on **SAVE>RIS(works with Endnote, Citavi, etc.)**.

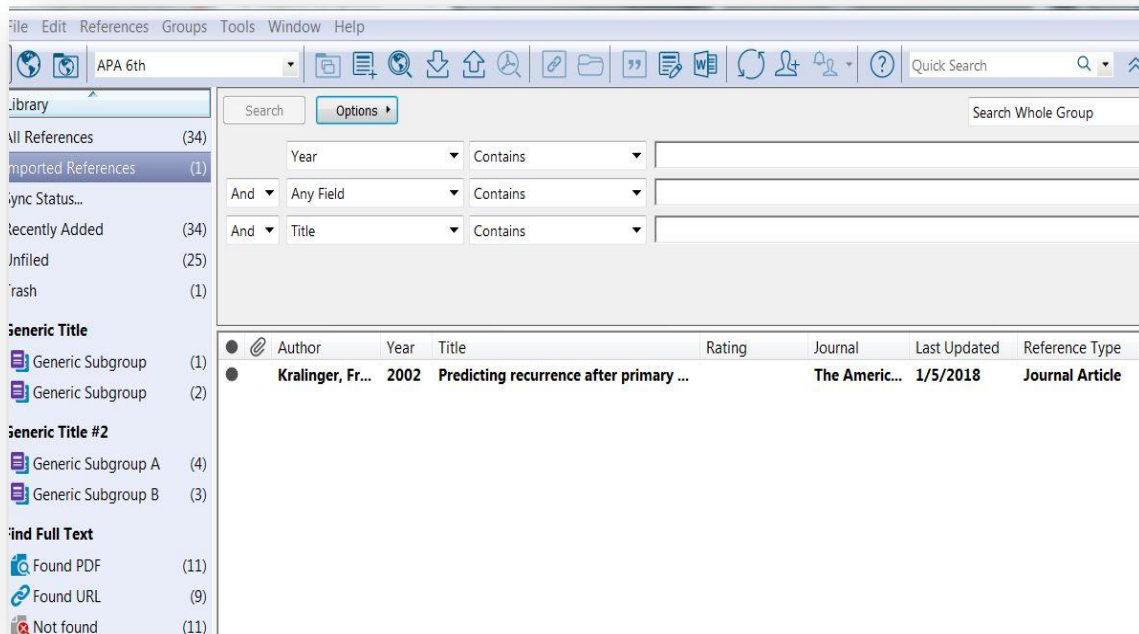
- 2) Click **CONTINUE** (Make sure 'Output to' is set to "RIS (works with EndNote, Citavi, etc.)")



3) You will be prompted to open a "ProQuestDocument...ris" file.



4) Once the file has been opened, the citation will appear in your EndNote library.
